

Amendments to Supplementary Examination in existing Regulations
(with effect from 2020-21)

As per the clause S22.12 (22/SENATE/2024/RESOLUTION/12) in the minutes of 22nd senate meeting held on 13th May 2024 and Circulation Agenda dated 10th July 2024, the following amendment for Supplementary Examination has been approved.

22/SENATE/2024/RESOLUTION/12 and Circulation Agenda dated 10th July 2024

Students who get “F” or “I” grade are eligible to appear for Supplementary Examination.

The Supplementary Examination will normally be held during a specific week of the subsequent semester.

In the case of a student who has got “I” grade / “F” grade in the regular examination, the marks obtained by the student in Cycle tests and Assignments will be added to the marks obtained in Supplementary examination and will be graded as per the grading policy used for his/her class. This is applicable for in the subsequent supplementary examination time.

If the student fails again or does not appear for the subsequent supplementary examination, absolute grading system with a passing minimum of 30% shall be followed in subsequent supplementary exams. A student will be awarded ‘E’ grade if he/she gets more than or equal to 30% whatever be the scoring in the examination. Otherwise, he/she will be awarded with ‘F’ grade.

In case a student fails in the Supplementary Examination, he/she has to reappear till the maximum duration as mentioned in regulation 4c.

In the case of a student fails in the Eighth semester, Special Supplementary Examination will be conducted after 4 weeks of result declaration. The student’s name will be enrolled with the current batch for the award of degree in the Convocation if he/she completes the subjects.

The Supplementary Examination / Special Supplementary Examination will be conducted by the course teacher who offered the course or a faculty member nominated by the HoD.

For taking Supplementary Examinations, the students have to register with prescribed examination fee.
